

Short Haul Truck Driver

Short haul drivers are responsible for hauling freight and cargo over shorter distances; a driver would typically leave early in the day and make a series of pick-ups and drop-offs and be back home by evening. In some instances, short-haul drivers may spend a night away from home though this is not so common for PEI drivers. Short haul drivers may be responsible for loading and unloading their trucks, so some level of physical fitness is necessary.

Some desirable traits our employers look for in a short haul driver would be: a good work ethic; some level of mechanical understanding and skills; flexibility in scheduling; good customer service and communication skills; ability to work independently; and problem solving skills.



Though most short haul drivers stay relatively close to home, they typically put in longer than average work days. It's not uncommon to see 12+ hours shifts. Keep in mind, some short haul work is tied to weather and the seasons, so drivers typically put in longer hours when the sun is shining and may have slower weeks when the weather does not cooperate.
