

# PEI TRUCKING WORKFORCE



#### **SIZE OF WORKFORCE**

Approximately 4000 people work in the PEI Trucking industry. About half of them are truck drivers! Other career options include Mechanic, Dispatcher, Recruiter, Safety, Human Resources & More.



#### **PAY & BENEFITS**

The following is a breakdown of average pay for key occupations in the industry. Keep in mind that these numbers are broad and are not broken down to account for things like seasonality or certified vs. non-certified, etc.

**Long Haul Driver (1A) - \$63,000** Local/Regional Driver (1A) - \$44,000 Straight Truck Driver(3A) - \$38,000 Truck Mechanic - \$51,000

Dispatcher - \$55,000 HR / Safety - \$51,000 Managers - \$53,000 Administration - \$41,000



#### **EDUCATION**

When it comes to education levels, we are evenly split: ~33% Less than Highschool, ~33% with high school & ~33% with post secondary training.



When it comes to gender, trucking is mostly male dominated with only 8% women. We'd love to change that though! Many of our women are truck drivers.



Our average age in the industry is around 57 years old. On average people enter the industry at age 33.
